

LESSON PLAN

Work at the Dairy-Part 1/ Trabajar en una Lechería- Parte 1

Lesson Duration: 30-40 minutes

Lesson Instructions

• Teach the vocabulary:

- Distribute the vocabulary sheets. Use a large computer screen or the Quizlet flashcards to teach and elaborate on each vocabulary word.

- O Have student practice saying the words after you. Then flip the screen for the Spanish (or other language) translation.
- Repeat the term and give feedback until the student closely mimics your pronunciation.
- Have student practice with the vocabulary matching game.
